



TERMS & CONDITIONS

Cattlemen 100 MTB (2021 edition)

1. The Cattlemen 100 MTB is organised by 'the event organiser' Alps Link Regional Communities Association Inc. (ABN 22 178 866 133).
2. The participant accepts that they are entering the Cattlemen 100 MTB at their own risk and by registering, agrees that they are both mentally and physically capable of riding the distance they have chosen.
3. The participant accepts the event they have chosen as either competitive or noncompetitive.
4. Participants agree their personal information may be collected and used by Velo Grammont for communication, safety and medical reasons. This includes the emergency contact information if a medical transport is required. All rider information will be stored in line with the Victorian data protection laws.
5. The event registration form must be completed by a person aged 18 years or over. Evidence of age may be requested. If a rider is under the age of 18 parental consent must be provided.
6. The participant is fully responsible for their actions whilst at the event. It is expected that the participant acts in a safe and responsible manner pre/post and within the ride itself.
7. It is mandatory for cyclists to wear appropriate attire, including a helmet that regulates with government standards. The event organiser reserves the right to disqualify participants who do not wear a helmet during the ride.
8. The participant confirms that the bike they are riding during the event is suitable for the terrain and is road worthy. The bicycle the participant chooses to ride will have the ability to withstand paved, non-paved and backcountry terrain.
9. During the event there will be directional and safety signage. The participant accepts that they will be cycling on public roads and all road rules apply. Participants are expected to be competent bike riders and be able to adjust to the conditions.
10. As a condition of entry it will be mandatory for riders to carry their mobile phone at all times. Their personal information (name and phone number) will be available to key event personnel pre/post and during the event.
11. The event organiser reserves the right to change the route at any time.
12. To the best of their ability participants will follow the course route mapped out for them and will not take any shortcuts.

13. Participants agree that any photography taken throughout the course can be used for promotional material. The participant hereby releases the event organiser from any and all liability from such use of promotion. The participant waives any right to any compensation they may have for appearing in any promotional material.
14. Each participant will be fully responsible for any fees or costs incurred or arising from an accident either involving or caused by the rider. This includes, but not exclusive to, fees from police, Ambulance, Fire and Rescue. If the situation arises that you are not capable of making the decision to call the emergency service, the rider agrees that a member of the event organisation or a member of the public may call for them. In this situation, the rider still accepts the costs and consequences of such action. It is recommended that the participant has an Ambulance Victoria membership.
15. Upon registering, participants will provide correct medical and insurance information, if they have available. Although not compulsory it is advisable that all participants acquire rider insurance such as a week license through Cycling Victoria. The participant understands that if they choose not to they are fully liable for any damages, injury or other caused to themselves or others.
16. The event organiser is not responsible for any damages caused to bikes and or accessories throughout the event, or pre/post ride. The event organiser does not take responsibility for any items that have been stolen, misplaced or mistreated. It is up to the participants to take care of their own property.
17. Participants agree to receive pre/post event communications from the event organiser.
18. Upon registering, participants will, to the best of their ability, agree to attend all briefings set out by them prior to the event.
19. Upon approaching a checkpoint all participants will abide by COVID-safe practices.
20. The rider acknowledges and agrees that participating to the Cattlemen 100 MTB event is dangerous and that they participate in the event at their own risk.
21. It is understood that the date of the event is Saturday 20th of November 2021, unless otherwise revised due to COVID19 or other restrictions.

COVID19 REFUND POLICY SUMMARY

We understand there is some apprehension in purchasing tickets for this event due to the current circumstances. In light of this we have implemented cancellation and refund policies for your peace of mind.

What if the Victorian Government prevents from the event to go ahead?

If the Victorian or Federal Government restrictions are still heavily in place and the event needs to reschedule or be cancelled, riders have the options to cancel their entry and receive a credit to a rescheduled event (within 18 months) or receive a full refund.

What if the event proceeds but Government restrictions prevent me from travelling?

If you are in a postcode or area of lockdown that restricts you from travelling than Velo Grammont will allow participants to cancel their entry and receive a credit to a rescheduled event (within 18 months) or receive a full refund.

What if I cannot attend the event due to medical or reasons other than COVID19?

If cancellation of participation occurs within 48 hours from the event than a full refund or credit will NOT be issued. However, any cancellation made with more than 48 hours notice will be issued a full credit or refund (entry cost minus \$10.00 admin fee).
